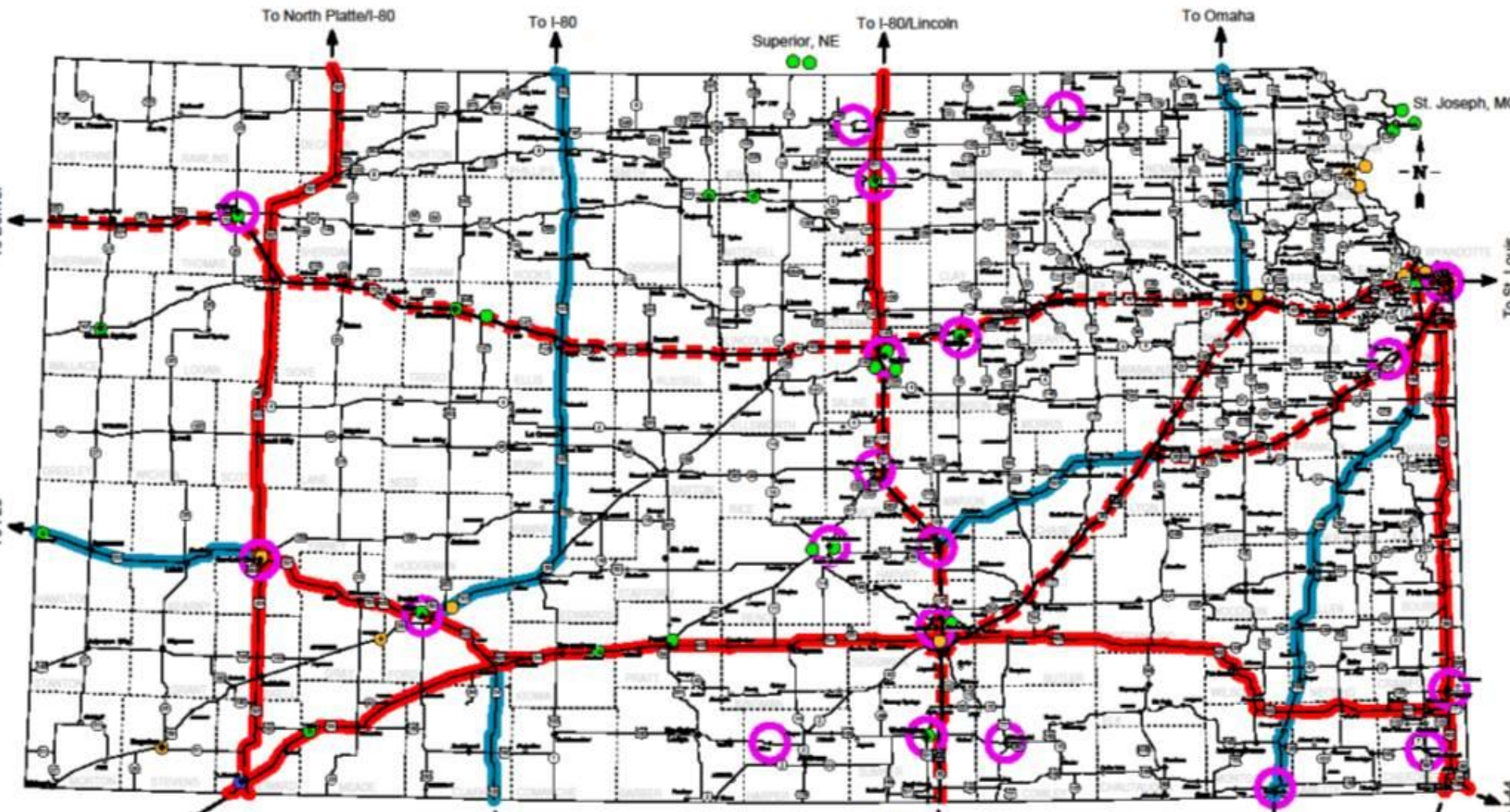

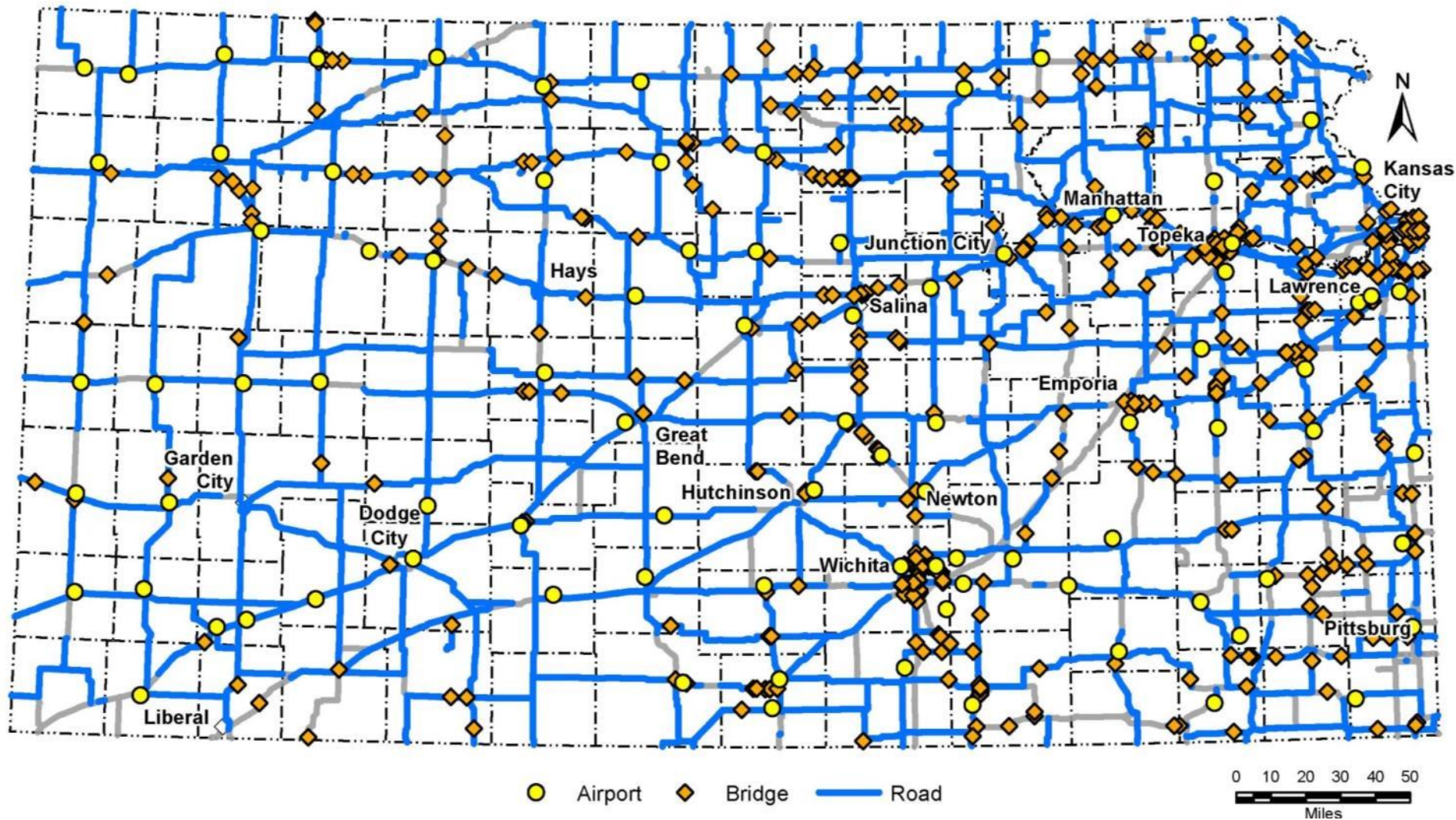

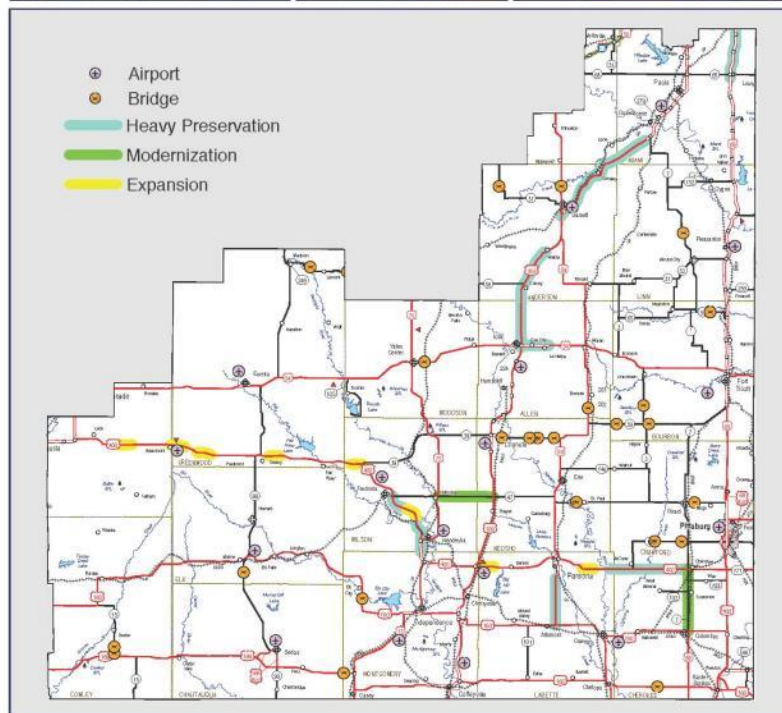

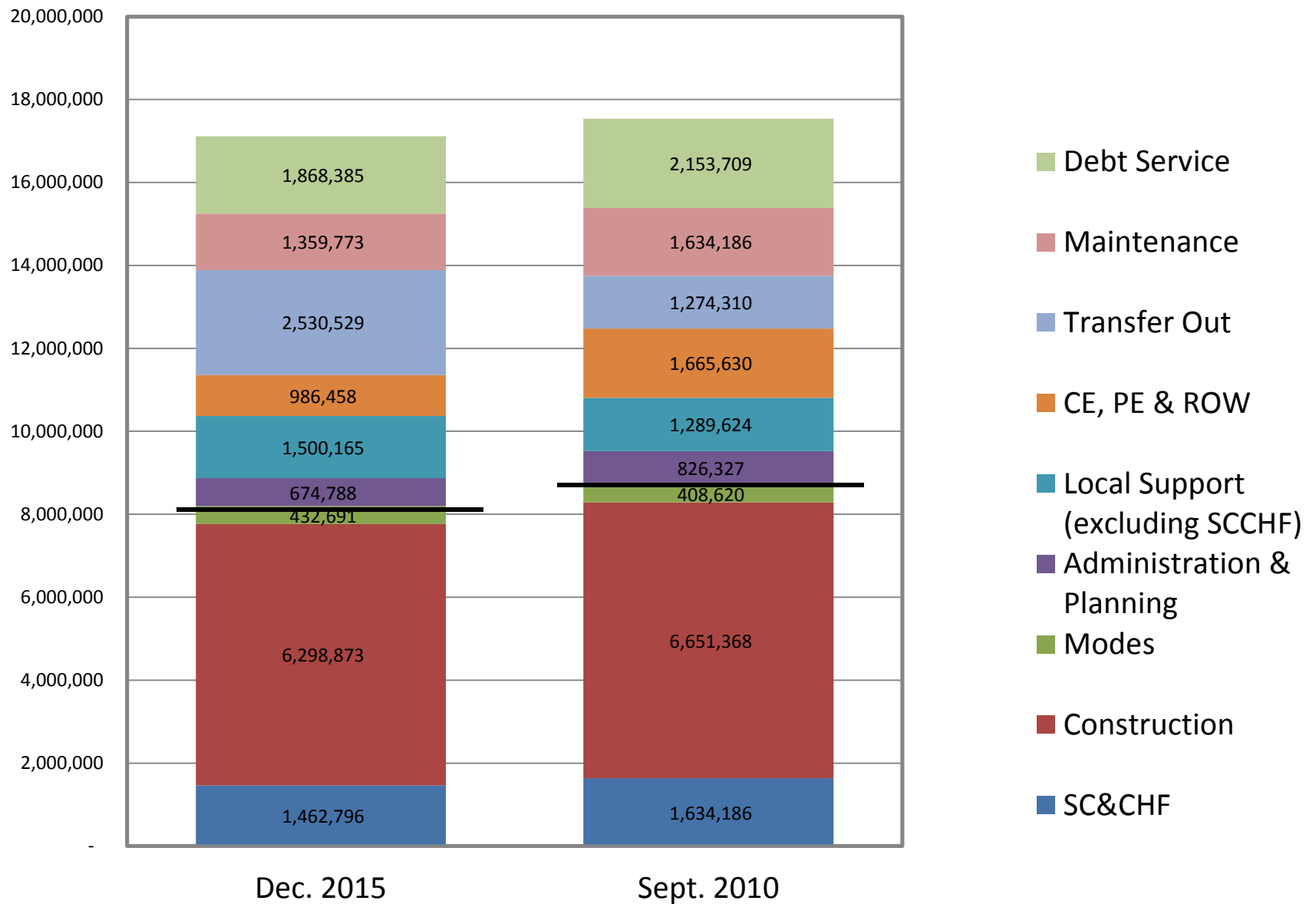

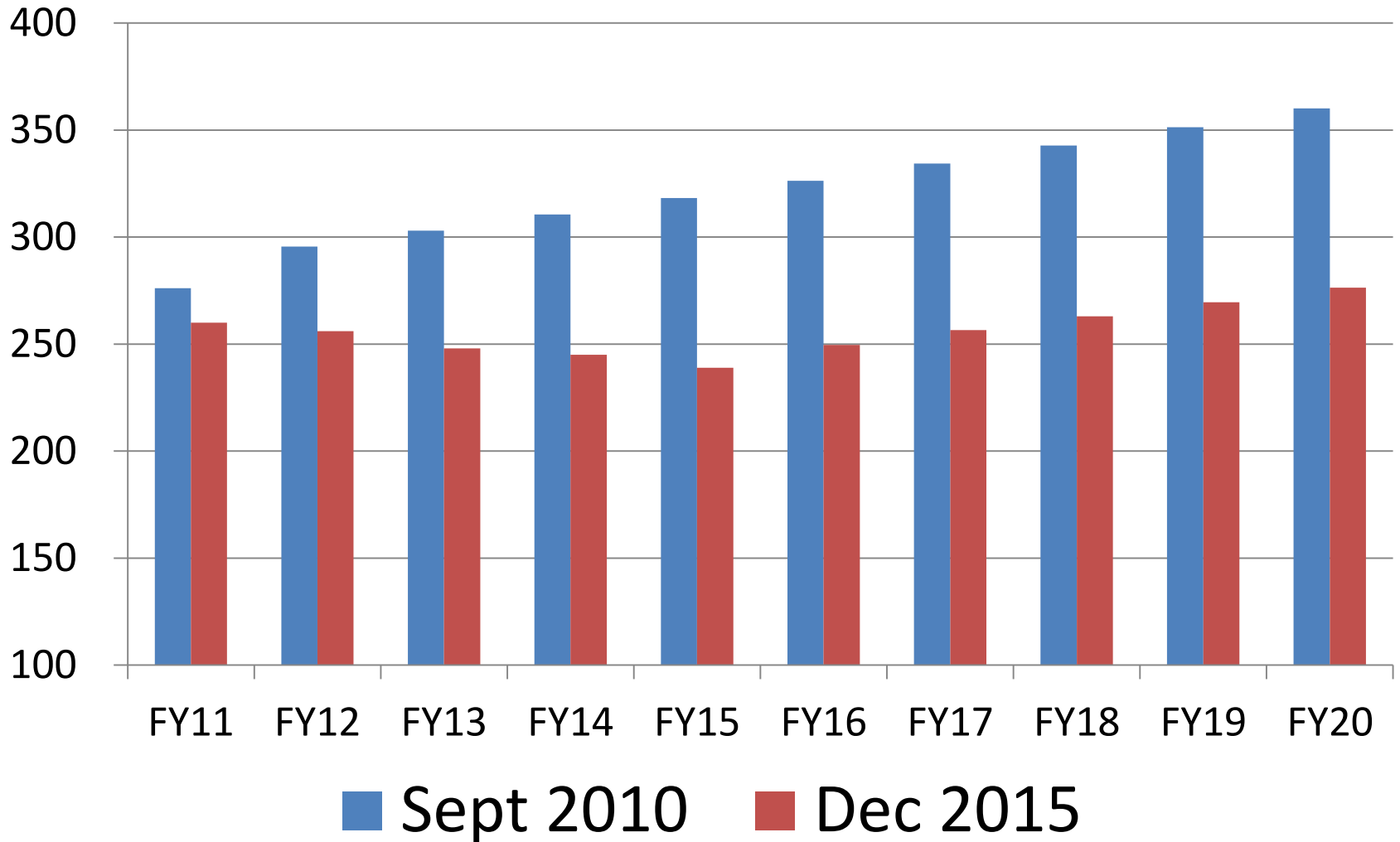
- K-7 from K-7/US-160 junction (Columbus), north to CK/CR County line

\$375,006,000 total construction dollars invested to date

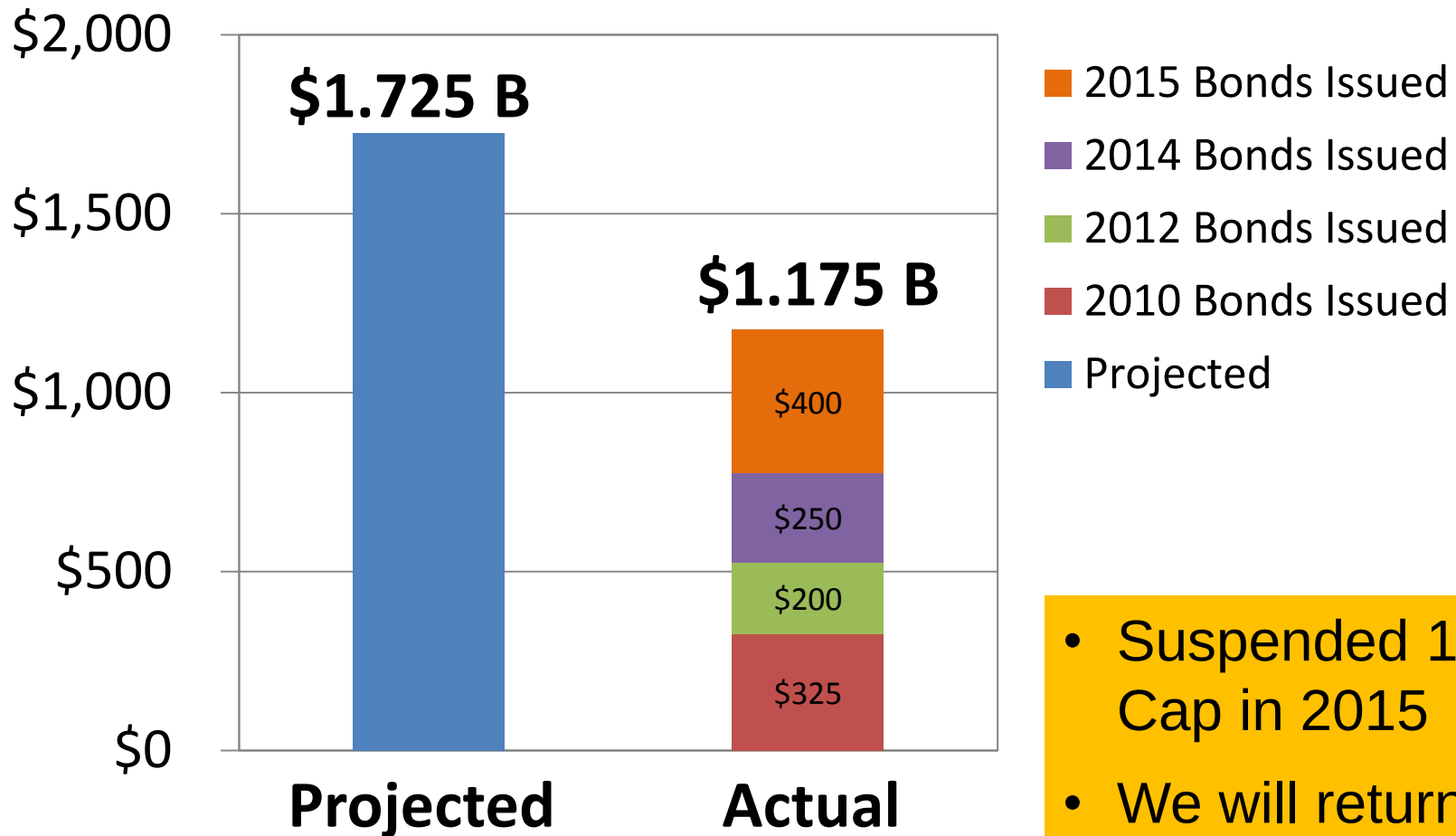

All KDOT Expenditures



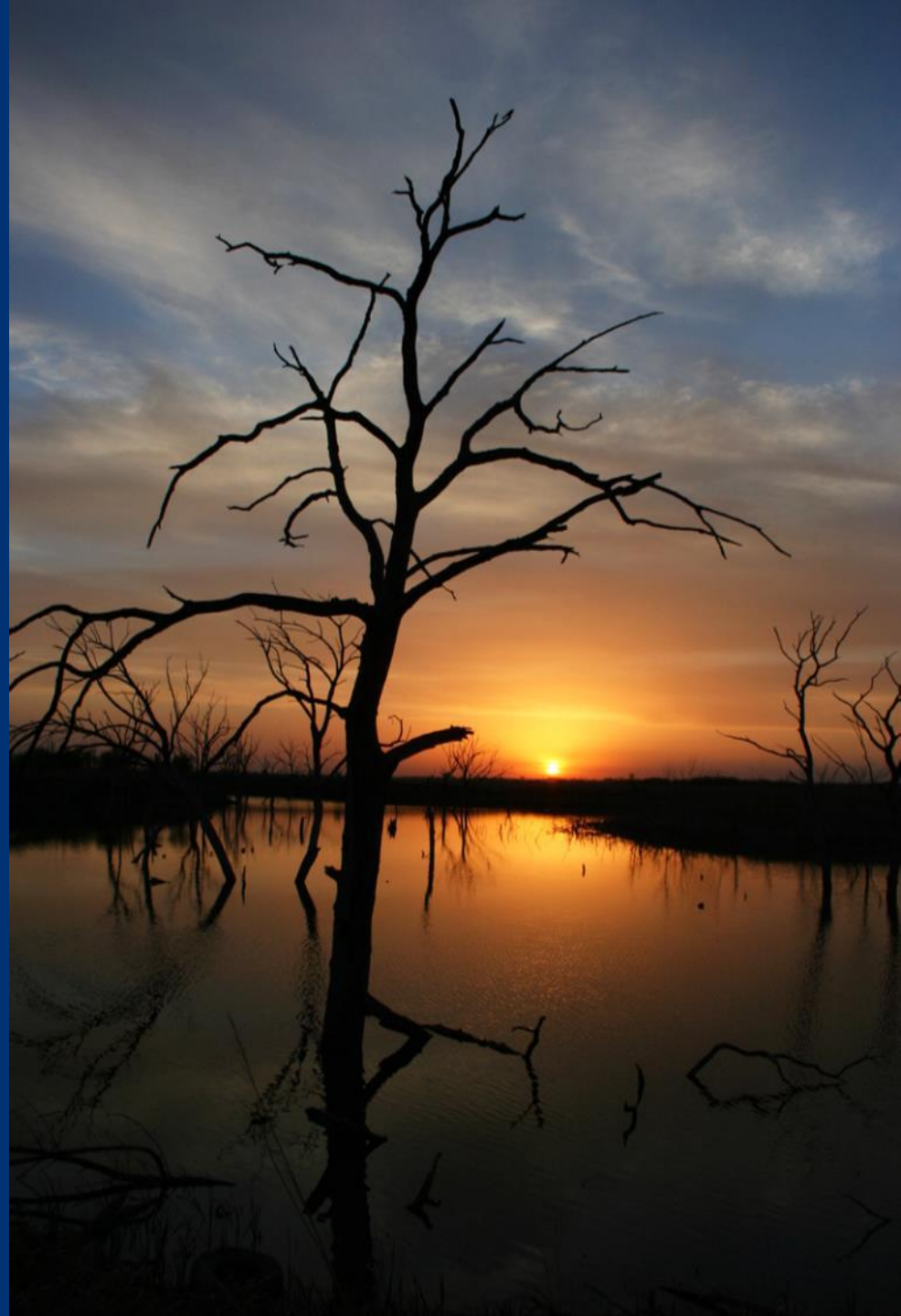
**Agency Operations Budget:

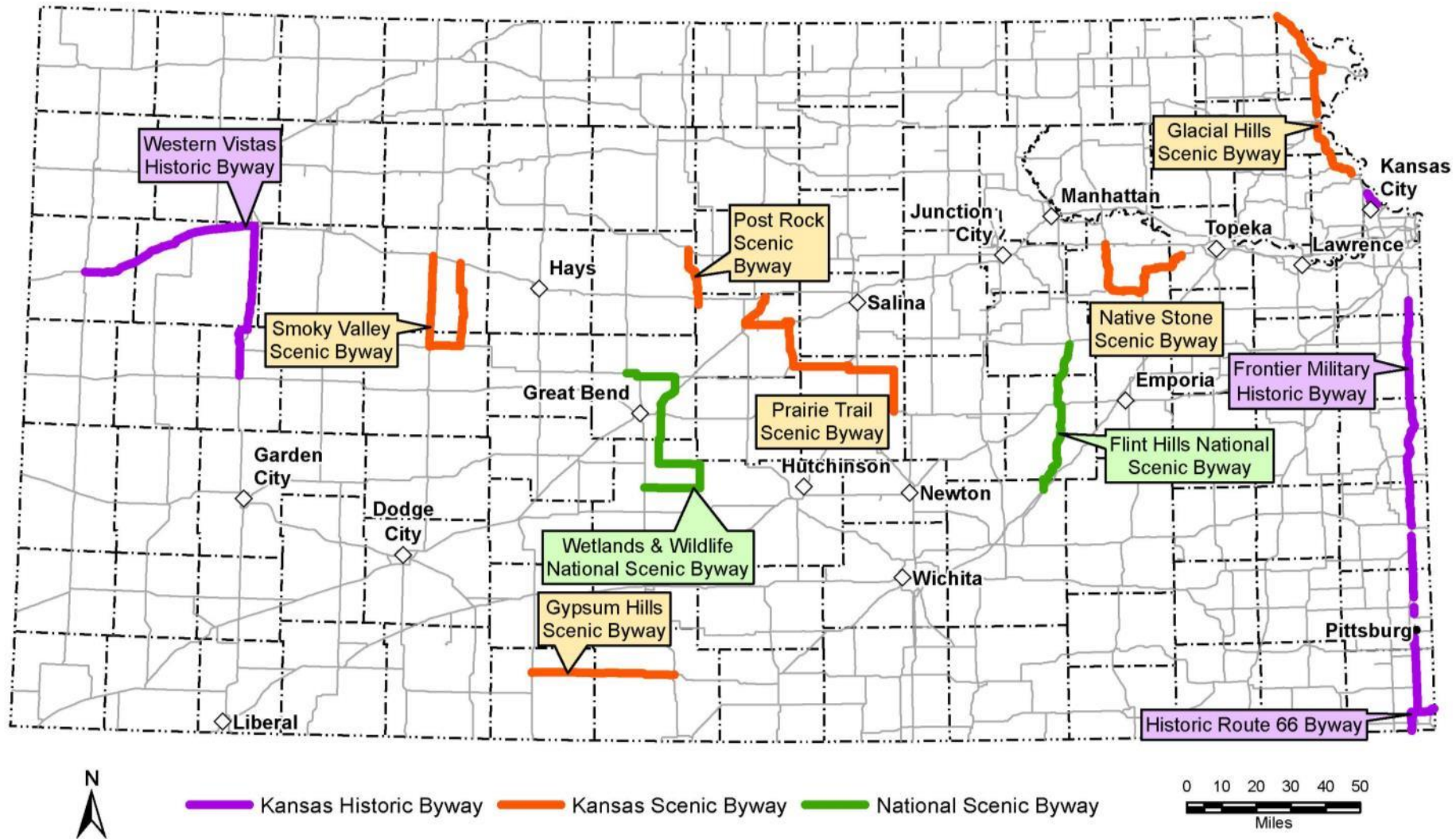

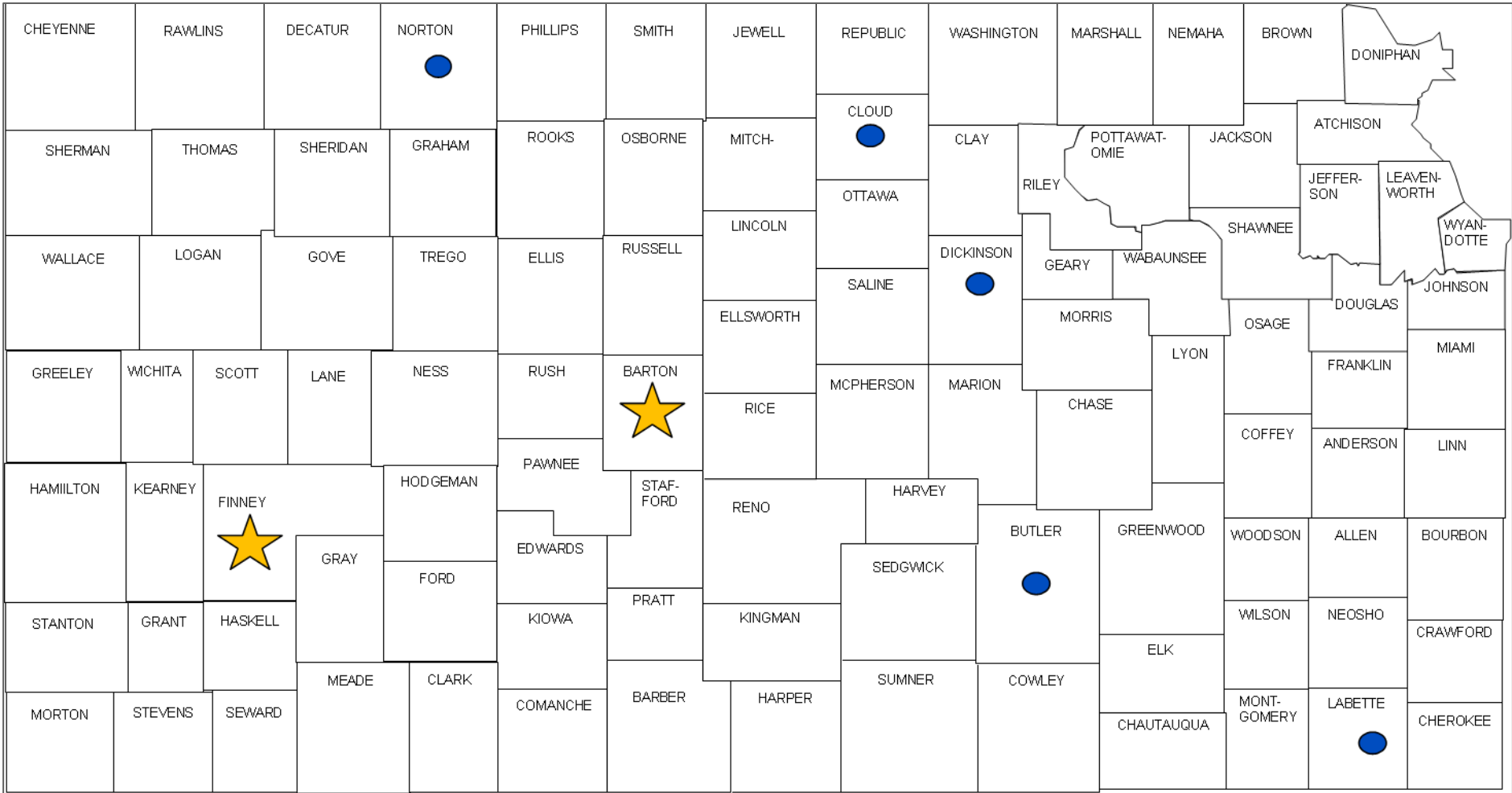

SAFETY
