SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2092 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2092 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

For a person whose seizure disorder is not controlled, the Director of Vehicles or the Medical Advisory Board of the Department of Revenue may recommend the issuance of a restricted license to drive only Class C or M vehicles for operating as deemed appropriate to assure the safe operation of the motor vehicle by the licensee. HB 2092 would clarify that a seizure disorder includes blackouts and syncope events. The bill would require the licensee to notify the Division in writing within ten days of a seizure, blackout, or syncope event. The bill provides that any of these events or loss of consciousness would result in a six-month revocation of driving privileges.

The Department of Revenue indicates that HB 2092 would have no fiscal effect on agency operations.
