SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2460 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2460 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, violations of the Kansas Offender Registration Act are designated as person felonies of varying severity levels. HB 2460 would designate these violations as person or nonperson crimes in accordance with the designation assigned to the underlying crime for which the offender is required to be registered.

The Kansas Department of Corrections indicates it cannot provide a fiscal effect because the number of individuals who would be incarcerated or that would commit registration violations is unknown.

The Kansas Sentencing Commission estimates that enactment of HB 2460 would not have an effect on adult prison admissions or bed space. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2460 is not reflected in *The FY 2017 Governor's Budget Report*.
