SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 465 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 465 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 465 would amend current law regarding the list of disorders or diseases approved for treatment through the use of a controlled substance. The bill would add attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder and binge eating disorder to the list of disorders.

The Board of Healing Arts indicates that enactment of SB 465 could increase the number of reports or complaints regarding practitioners violating the provisions of the bill. Any increase in complaints resulting in investigations would increase operational expenses; the Board, however, is unable to estimate what the increase would be. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 465 is not reflected in *The FY 2017 Governor's Budget Report*.
