1 AN ACT relating to diabetes information reporting.

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3 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

4 Section 1. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall identify
5 goals and benchmarks and develop plans to reduce the incidence of
6 diabetes in Kansas, improve diabetes care and control complications
7 associated with diabetes.

8 (b) The secretary shall submit a report to the legislative coordinating
9 council by January 10 of each even-numbered year on the following:

10 (1) The financial impact and reach diabetes is having on the
11 department of health and environment, the state of Kansas and localities
12 within the state, including the number of individuals with diabetes
13 impacted or covered by programs administered by the secretary, the
14 number of individuals with diabetes and family members impacted by
15 prevention and diabetes control programs implemented by the department,
16 if any, the financial toll or impact diabetes and its complications places on
17 the department and the financial toll or impact diabetes and its
18 complications places on the department in comparison to other chronic
19 diseases and conditions;

20 (2) an assessment of the benefits of implemented programs and
21 activities aimed at controlling diabetes and preventing the disease shall
22 include documenting the amount and source for any funding directed to
23 the department from the Kansas legislature for programs and activities
24 aimed at reaching those with diabetes;

25 (3) a description of the level of coordination existing in the
26 department, programmatic activities and messaging concerning managing,
27 treating or preventing all forms of diabetes and its complications;

28 (4) the development or revision of detailed action plans for battling
29 diabetes with a range of actionable items for consideration by the
30 legislature, which shall identify proposed action steps to reduce the impact
31 of diabetes, pre-diabetes and related diabetes complications and identify
32 the expected benchmarks for controlling and preventing relevant forms of
33 diabetes; and

34 (5) the development of a detailed budget blueprint identifying needs,
35 costs and resources required to implement the plan identified in subsection
36 (b)(4), which blueprint shall include a budget range for all options

1 presented in such plan for consideration by the legislature.

2 (c) The requirements of this section shall be limited to the diabetes
3 information, data, initiatives and programs within the department prior to
4 the effective date of this act, unless there is unobligated funding for
5 diabetes in the department that may be used for new research, data
6 collection, reporting or other requirements of this section.

7 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
8 publication in the statute book.
