AN ACT concerning state psychiatric hospitals; establishing the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight which shall consist of 10 members appointed as follows: (1) The chairperson of the senate committee on public health and welfare, or the chairperson's designee; (2) the chairperson of the house committee on health and human services, or the chairperson's designee; (3) the chairperson of the senate committee on ways and means, or the chairperson's designee; (4) the chairperson of the house committee on appropriations, or the chairperson's designee; (5) the ranking minority member of the senate committee on ways and means; (6) the ranking minority member of the house committee on appropriations; and (7) the member of the house of representatives from each representative district and the member of the senate from each senate district in which a state psychiatric hospital is located.

- (b) Members shall be appointed for terms coinciding with the legislative terms for which such members are elected or appointed. All members appointed to fill vacancies in the membership of the joint committee and all members appointed to succeed members appointed to membership on the joint committee shall be appointed in the manner provided for the original appointment of the member succeeded.
- (c) The chairperson of the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight shall be selected as follows:
- (1) The initial chairperson shall be the member of the house of representatives or the senate with the most years of service as a legislator from those members of the house of representatives or the senate designated in subsection (a)(7). Such chairperson shall serve a term ending on December 31, 2016.
- (2) Each subsequent chairperson shall be elected by a quorum of the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight at the first meeting of the calendar year. Such chairperson shall serve a term ending on December 31 of such calendar year.
- (d) The joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight shall meet upon the call of the chairperson. The joint committee on state

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 psychiatric hospital oversight may meet at any time and at any place within the state as designated by the chairperson.

- (e) Members of the joint committee on state psychiatric oversight shall be paid compensation, travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowance pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto, for attendance at any meeting of the joint committee authorized by the legislative coordinating council.
- (f) In accordance with K.S.A. 46-1204, and amendments thereto, the legislative coordinating council may provide for such professional services as may be requested by the joint committee on state psychiatric oversight.
- (g) A quorum of the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight shall be six.
- (h) The joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight may make recommendations and introduce such legislation as deemed necessary in performing such joint committee's functions.
- (i) In addition to other powers and duties prescribed by law or by the legislative coordinating council, the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight shall:
- (1) Monitor the patient population and review and study the activities and plans of the treatment programs and the correlation to patient outcomes;
- (2) tour each state psychiatric hospital, considering and evaluating facility issues relating to plant management and safety;
- (3) review and study the Kansas department for aging and disability services (KDADS) policies relating to each state psychiatric hospital;
- (4) review and study KDADS responsiveness and efforts in identifying and resolving issues relating to facility, staff and patients;
- (5) review and study KDADS staffing programs and policies relating to staffing, recruitment, retention, employee morale and employee relations issues:
 - (6) review and identify patient and employee safety concerns; and
- (7) review and study any other issues that the joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight identifies or have been brought to the joint committee's attention.
- (j) The joint committee on state psychiatric hospital oversight shall make an annual report to the legislative coordinating council as provided in K.S.A. 46-1207, and amendments thereto, and such special reports to the house of representatives and senate as are deemed appropriate by the joint committee.
- (k) The staff of the office of revisor of statutes, the legislative research department and the division of legislative administrative services shall provide such assistance as may be requested by the joint committee on state psychiatric oversight.

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- 1 (l) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2020.
