SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 128

As Recommended by House Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

House Sub. for SB 128 would change the number of nominees a district judicial nominating commission would be required to nominate for each vacancy from two or three to three, four, or five. The bill also would amend the section governing what occurs if there are not at least two qualified attorneys who reside in the judicial district willing to accept a nomination, to change two to three.

Background

The provisions of SB 128, concerning exceptions to the Kansas Open Records Act, were added to SB 206 and enacted in that bill.

The House Committee on Judiciary struck the contents of SB 128 and replaced them with the contents of HB 2562.

HB 2652 Background

HB 2652 was introduced in the House Committee on Judiciary at the request of Representative Macheers. At the House Committee hearing, a representative of Kansans for Life appeared in support of the bill. No opponent or neutral testimony was offered.
