**MEMORANDUM**

Subject: **HB2279 Disposition of drivers' license reinstatement fees and the judicial branch nonjudicial salary adjustment fund**

Under current law, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-241, persons who lose their driving privileges because of a DUI conviction or DUI test failure (1<sup>st</sup> occurrence \$200, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$400, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$600, 4<sup>th</sup> or subsequent \$800) or DUI test refusal conviction or DUI test refusal (1<sup>st</sup> occurrence \$600, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$900, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$1,200, 4<sup>th</sup> or subsequent \$1,500) are required to pay such additional restatement fees. July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2018, the moneys collected are distributed as follows: 26% to the community alcoholism and intoxication programs fund, 12% to the juvenile alternatives to detention fund; 12% to the forensic laboratory and materials fee fund, 17% to the driving under the influence fund, and 33% to the judicial branch nonjudicial salary adjustment fund. July 1, 2018, the moneys collected are distributed as follows: 35% to the community alcoholism and intoxication programs fund, 20% to the juvenile alternatives to detention fund, 20% to the forensic laboratory and materials fee fund, and 25% to the driving under the influence fund.

HB2279 would extend the dates for one year for the judicial branch nonjudicial salary adjustment fund to receive 33% of the additional restatement fees.

The bill further strikes language on how the moneys in the judicial branch nonjudicial salary adjustment fund shall be expended.
