Representative Waymaster:

After I presented an informational briefing regarding the issue of unsubmitted sexual assault kits to the House Appropriations Committee on March 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017, Representative Alcala asked a question regarding laboratory efficiency recognized as a result of the new forensic laboratory. Specifically, he asked for the increased productivity to be provided in percentage format.

There are many factors we consider in evaluating laboratory efficiency and productivity. These include the number of new laboratory submissions, items of evidence received, number of subpoenas received, how many cases are in backlog status, and the average turn-around time.

Cases in backlog status are those that have been pending examination for more than 30 days. Turn-around time is the amount of time, measured in days, between when a case is submitted to the laboratory and when the laboratory report of examination is issued.

The following percentages are reflective of the percent change between calendar year 2014 and calendar year 2016 in each of the categories. Please note, this data is reflective of all laboratory services, not any one discipline in particular.

- New laboratory submissions increased by 3.7%
- The number of items of evidence received increased by 9.8%
- The number of laboratory reports issued increased by 3.6%
- The number of subpoenas received increased by 20.1%
- The number of cases in backlog status decreased by 10.7%
- The average turn-around time decreased by 7.6%

Overall, our backlogs and turn-around times have decreased while our service levels and outputs have increased. I have attached a chart with the raw data.
