Written Testimony before House Elections House Bill 2223 by Carol Williams, Executive Director February 6, 2017

This testimony is provided for informational purposes. The Governmental Ethics Commission does not take a position on HB 2223. House Bill 2223 amends the Campaign Finance Act by eliminating the current language in K.S.A. 25-4152 as it pertains to civil penalty assessments for the late filing of campaign finance reports and statements. Under current law, when a campaign finance report or statement is late, the Commission sends a certified failure to file notice to the candidate and his or her treasurer, as well as the treasurers for party committees and political action committees. The notice states the individual has 15 days from the date the notice is placed in the mail before a \$10 a day civil penalty in imposed for each day the report remains unfiled. The maximum civil penalty is \$300. Individuals are permitted to request a waiver of their civil penalty and for good cause, the Commission may waive such civil penalty.

During the 2016 election year, 143 candidates, party and political action committees were late in filing their receipts and expenditures reports. Civil penalties in the amount of \$5,310 were assessed for the late filing of these 2016 reports. The Commission waived \$600 in civil penalties. Civil penalties in the amount of \$3,670 were assessed in January 2017 for the late filing of the 2016 wrap-up report. The individuals assessed civil penalties in January have one month from the date of their notice to request a waiver of their civil penalty.
