When the rural opportunity zones were first established, Cowley County was just above the threshold for attaining that status. Because of changes to many other economic development incentives, Cowley County is now at a disadvantage on two fronts. Because of its size, Cowley is not capable of securing corporate investments of the magnitude that large metropolitan areas can draw. At the same time, it cannot take advantage of incentives that counties in the Rural Opportunity Zones (ROZ) can obtain.

Since the inception of ROZ, there have been many additional counties included in the criteria. The program is now at the point where Cowley County should qualify. The county lost a number of economic development tools when the Rural Opportunity Zones were established and rules were changed for non-qualifiers. Cowley County is asking that they be allowed to participate in a program that many other counties of the same size and economic status are now a part. It would go a long way toward helping the county, draw business, improve housing, create jobs, and ultimately draw more people to Kansas.
