



## Testimony to House Taxation Committee SB 167 Citizens Right to Vote on Property Tax Increases March 16, 2017 Dave Trabert, President

Chairperson Tyson and Members of the Committee,

We appreciate this opportunity to testify in opposition of SB 167, which would strip citizens of their statutory right to vote on whether, with some exceptions, property taxes should increase by more than inflation.

The right to vote on property tax increases exists because Kansans are livid over outrageous property tax hikes imposed on them by city and county government. Inflation was just 44% between 1997 and 2016, yet 82 counties had property tax increases greater than 100%. Of those 82 counties, 24 had increases greater than 200% and 4 of them had increases over 300%!

The attached page shows the comparative changes for the home counties of each Committee member. Among them, the ‘best’ county – Sedgwick – ‘only’ increased taxes 1.4 times more than the combined rates of inflation and population. Condolences are extended to Senator Goddard however, as Labette County increased taxes 4.5 times more than the combined rates of inflation and population.

The following results of a December 2015 market research study<sup>1</sup> reflect Kansans’ overwhelming desire to be able to vote. There was still a 3-year delay at the time of the survey, but 69% of Kansans believed voting was a good idea with only 19% opposed.
