RE: Written Testimony in Support of SB 167

The governing body of the City of Mount Hope, Kansas supports the repeal of the Tax Lid which becomes effective January 1, 2018. The Tax Lid will have a negative impact on our efforts for community growth and efforts to maintain the infrastructure in our small town.

In the current 2017 budget year, if the Tax Lid had been in force, our maximum levy would have been capped at \$211,694.00. The 2016 actual levy was \$210,906.00 making the maximum increase of dollars available in 2017 of only \$788.00 additional. So, any increase over this paltry amount of \$788.00, would have required a mandatory vote of the constituents. Please note exhibit "A" for the computations.

The health insurance cost for the city increased over \$5300.00 for the year to cover our employees and families. A \$788.00 increase does not begin to cover the health insurance cost increase. In addition, an educational entity has moved their operation to our community, requiring a School Resource Officer position be put in place, which will add an additional estimated \$9200.00 to the insurance costs for the year of 2017; not to mention the additional expense of adding another employee. This facility will be bringing a minimum of 35 new jobs to our community. Please refer to Exhibit "B".

The Sedgwick County Election office has provided an estimate of nearly \$1000.00 to provide a Mail Ballot for our community. This cost is more than our allowed increase of \$788.00; without a vote of the people. Based upon the 2017 budget figures, we've been negatively affected from the start. Please see Exhibit "C".

The examples shown do not even bring in to consideration the needs for equipment replacement, street improvements, KPERS increases, fuel cost increases and the like. Our local governing body is best prepared to assess and decide what is necessary and proper for our community's future.

Please repeal the Tax Lid and give the authority back to the local constituents, where it belongs.
