Dear Senate Commerce Committee Chair and Committee Members:

On behalf of Key Construction, Inc. and its 130+ employees, I would like to encourage you to ***VOTE YES on Senate Bill 212.***

Senate Bill 212 would provide the opportunity for the State of Kansas to become the 27th State in the U.S. to make application and, once approved, have "local control" of the enforcement/management of Federal OSHA regulations.
