Substitute for SENATE BILL NO. 432

By Committee on Commerce

AN ACT concerning STAR bonds; relating to establishment of an underwriting commission; project information on department of commerce website; project costs; STAR bond project financial viability determination; requirements for project approval; audit report; reports to legislature; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 12-17,162, 12-17,164, 12-17,166, 12-17,169, 12-17,171 and 12-17,176 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the STAR bond underwriting commission. The commission shall consist of three members. One member shall be appointed by the senate president, one member shall be appointed by the speaker of the house and one member shall be appointed by the secretary of commerce Senate minority leader. Each member of the commission shall have at least 10 years of experience in commercial banking, investment banking or real estate capital markets. Members may not be employed by or have any ownership or financial interest in a developer that has participated or is participating in a STAR bond project. A member shall not participate in a decision on an application submitted by the city or county in which the member resides or if the member has an ownership or financial interest in a business located in that city or county or locating or relocating into that city or county.

(b) The members first appointed to the commission shall be appointed within 60 days after the effective date of this act. Of the members first appointed to the commission, as determined by the senate president, speaker of the house and the secretary of commerce Senate minority leader by agreement or by selection by chance, one member shall be appointed to serve for one year, one member shall be appointed to serve for two years, and one member shall be appointed to serve for three years. Thereafter, members shall be appointed for terms of three years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. A member may not serve more than
