Thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony in support of House Bill 95, the "SOAR" Act (Strategic Opportunities to Achieve Results), which will help maximize positive outcomes for Kansas children and families.

Our charitable work strengthens communities by advancing the goals of youth development, healthy living and social responsibility.

The YMCA has a long history of helping prepare children and families for life-long success to ensure that everyone regardless of age, income or background, has the opportunity to thrive. As a nonprofit organization, the Y plays a critical role in delivering quality early learning programs to infants, toddlers and preschoolers, and supporting working families. As such, we feel the modest reforms proposed in the SOAR Act will help provide more pathways to success for vulnerable Kansans. More specifically, the bill's proposed allowance of increased educational/job training attainment for parents with dependent children and the extension of support to single mothers to 12-months before TANF work requirements commence is very much aligned with the Kansas Alliance of YMCA's top priority of "increasing access, affordability and quality of early learning, childcare and after school youth programs and services to help every child in Kansas reach their full potential."
