## **Neutral Testimony – HB 2232**

Thank you for the opportunity to present neutral testimony on behalf of the Kansas Sentencing Commission. This bill seeks to regulate electronic monitoring in adult care homes. While the purpose of the bill is laudable and the aims are reasonable, the Commission wants to caution the committee regarding the severity level that has been placed on the criminal conduct in the bill, specifically a severity level 4, nonperson felony as set forth on subsection (m)(3)(C) of Section 1 of the amended bill.

A fundamental function of the Commission is to be gatekeepers of the Kansas Sentencing Guidelines act that was passed in 1993. We provide legislative bed space impacts for all of the criminal bills that are normally introduced in Senate Judiciary, House Corrections and Juvenile Justice and House Judiciary committees. A section of the impact includes a proportionality section to allow legislators to determine if the proposed crime severity level is appropriate or proportional to that of existing crimes.

It is the responsibility of the Commission to recommend to policy makers ways to support and maintain these guidelines. One of those recommendations is to consider proportionality of crimes when passing legislation. The Commission does not stand in support or opposition of the proposed bill but would like to bring to the attention of the committee that a severity level four felony is the same punishment for convictions of involuntary manslaughter, aggravated burglary and aggravated indecent liberties with a child. Please see the table on the following pages. Severity level four nondrug crimes carry a presumptive prison sentence of 38-172 months (3.2-14.3 years) depending on the offender's criminal history.
