Testimony on SB 26 relating to Vessel Registrations To The Senate Committee on Transportation

SB 26 seeks to raise the cap on vessel registration fees. **The Department supports the provisions contained in the bill.** The provisions of the bill would be effective July 1, 2017.

There are currently approximately 90,000 mechanically-propelled and sailing vessels registered with the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism for use on public waters. The current registration fee is \$30 for a three-year period, which is the cap of the registration fee allowed by statute.

This amendment would raise the statutory limit on vessel registration fees. **Registration fees** were last increased in 2006. These fees are used for boat ramp and access projects, safety buoys and marking dangerous objects in the waters of the state, and for boating safety enforcement. The Department is in danger of reverting federal funds for lack of matching funds for projects and the Boating Fee Fund hit all-time lows last year.

All Department fees are set by the KDWPT Commission after public hearings on the regulation.

The Department appreciates the support of the Committee in recommending favorably the bill.
