



Members of the Transportation Committee,

I want to thank the members of the Transportation Committee for giving due consideration to the proposed "Slow Down to Get Around" legislation before you. We stand in strong support of the legislation and know firsthand how beneficial such legislation can be for roadway safety in the communities we serve.

According to the National Waste & Recycling Association (NWRA), as many as 40 percent of American motorists are tempted to speed around waste collection vehicles when encountered on our roadways. By contrast, only one-third of American motorists admit to slowing down to get around waste collection vehicles. The data indicate a significant lack of understanding, within the general public, about the dangers associated with the waste industry, which according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics is deadlier than both law enforcement and firefighting professions.

The "Slow Down to Get Around" legislation before you will help protect not just our employees but all waste collection drivers in Kansas through education and increased penalties for distracted and careless motorists.
