(A) Expand broadband infrastructure and increase statewide access to broadband services;

(B) remove barriers that may hinder deployment of broadband infrastructure or access to broadband services; and

(C) enable the creation and deployment of new advanced communication technologies;

(4) prioritize the expansion of broadband services first to unserved areas of the state and then to underserved areas of the state; and

(5) make and submit a report to the legislature concerning all such work and recommendations of the task force. The task force report shall be submitted to the legislature on or before January 31, 2019.

(f) The staff of the office of revisor of statutes, the legislative research department and the division of legislative administrative services shall provide assistance as may be requested by the statewide broadband expansion task force.

(g) Legislative members of the statewide broadband expansion task force attending meetings authorized by the task force shall be paid amounts provided in K.S.A. 75-3223(e), and amendments thereto. Non-legislative members of the statewide broadband expansion task force may be reimbursed by their appointing authority.

(h) The provisions of this section shall expire on June 30, 2019.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

publication in the statute book (Kansas register).
