**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2069 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2069 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2069 would amend the definition of “conviction” provided in the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act qualifications of applicants for certification. A conviction would include a deferred judgement agreement entered into for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence or a misdemeanor offense that the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by the rules and regulations of the Commission. In addition, the bill would add to the definition a deferred judgement for a felony entered into after July 1, 1995.

According to the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training, passage of HB 2069 would have no fiscal effect on the agency.
