HOUSE BILL No. 2244

By Committee on Health and Human Services

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AN ACT concerning health and health care; relating to the department for health and environment; establishing the maternal mortality review committee.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the maternal mortality review committee within the department of health and environment. The purpose of the committee is to review maternal deaths and to develop strategies for the prevention thereof.

- (b) The committee shall be multidisciplinary and composed of nine or ten members who shall be appointed by the secretary for health and environment as follows:
- (1) The secretary for health and environment or the secretary's designee;
- (2) the director of the division of maternal and child health of the department of health and environment or the director's designee;
 - (3) a licensed physician with training in obstetrics;
 - (4) a licensed physician with training in neonatology;
 - (5) a licensed physician with training in perinatology;
 - (6) a certified nurse-midwife;
- (7) a hospital-based nurse with experience in obstetrics, labor and delivery, postpartum or maternity care;
 - (8) a member of the Kansas coroner's association; and
- (9) up to two additional members from multiple disciplines and relevant organizations, such as law enforcement, community health entities, department of health and environment statisticians or nosologists or county health officers.
- (c) Members of the maternal mortality review committee shall serve for a period of three years and shall elect a chair and a vice-chair whose duties shall be established by the committee. The department of health and environment shall fix a time and place for regular meetings of the committee, which shall meet at least twice yearly.
- (d) Members of the committee shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
 - (e) The committee may contract with an external organization to

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assist in collecting, analyzing and disseminating maternal mortality information, organizing and convening meetings of the committee and other tasks as may be incidental to these activities, including providing the necessary data, information and resources to ensure successful completion of the ongoing review required by this section.

(f) The committee shall:

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- (1) Identify maternal death cases:
- (2) review medical records and other relevant data;
- (3) contact family members and other affected or involved persons to collect additional relevant data;
 - (4) consult with relevant experts to evaluate the records and data;
- 12 (5) make determinations regarding the preventability of maternal deaths;
 - (6) develop recommendations for the prevention of maternal deaths; and
 - (7) disseminate findings and recommendations to policy makers, health care providers, health care facilities and the general public.
 - (g) (1) Health care providers licensed pursuant to chapters 65 and 74 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto; medical care facilities licensed pursuant to article 4 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statues Annotated, and amendments thereto, maternity centers licensed pursuant to article 5 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, and pharmacies licensed pursuant to article 16 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, shall provide reasonable access to all relevant medical records associated with a case under review by the committee.
 - (2) A health care provider, medical care facility, maternity center or pharmacy providing access to medical records pursuant to this section shall not be held liable for civil damages or be subject to criminal or disciplinary action for good faith efforts in providing such records.
 - (h) (1) Information, records, reports, statements, notes, memoranda or other data collected pursuant to this section shall be privileged and confidential and shall not be admissible as evidence in any action of any kind in any court or before another tribunal, board, agency or person. Such information, records, reports, statements, notes, memoranda or other data shall not be exhibited nor their contents disclosed in any way, in whole or in part, by any officer or representative of the department or any other person, except as may be necessary for the purpose of furthering the review of the committee of the case to which they relate. No person participating in such review shall disclose, in any manner, the information so obtained in strict conformity with such review project.
 - (2) All information, records of interviews, reports, statements, notes, memoranda or other data obtained by the department, the committee and

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other persons, agencies or organizations so authorized by the department pursuant to this section shall be confidential.

- (i) (1) All proceedings and activities of the committee under this section, opinions of members of such committee formed as a result of such proceedings and activities and records obtained, created or maintained pursuant to this section, including records of interviews, written reports and statements procured by the department of health and environment or any other person, agency or organization acting jointly or under contract with the department of health and environment in connection with the requirements of this section, shall be confidential and not subject to the provisions of the open records act, the open meetings act, or subject to subpoena, discovery or introduction into evidence in any civil or criminal proceeding. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or otherwise restrict the right to discover or use in any civil or criminal proceeding anything that is available from another source and entirely independent of the committee's proceedings.
- (2) Members of the committee shall not be questioned in any civil or criminal proceeding regarding the information presented in or opinions formed as a result of a meeting or communication of the committee. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a member of the committee from testifying to information obtained independently of the committee or that is public information.
- (j) The provisions of subsections (h) and (i) shall expire on July 1, 2022, unless the legislature acts to review and reenact the provisions prior to July 1, 2022.
- (k) Reports of aggregate non-individually indentifiable data shall be compiled on a routine basis for distribution in an effort to further study the causes and problems associated with maternal deaths. Reports shall be distributed to health care providers and facilities and others necessary to reduce the maternal death rate.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
