1 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to audits; amending K.S.A. 2016
2 Supp. 25-3104, 25-4403 and 25-4406 and repealing the existing
3 sections.

5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 New Section 1. (a) After an election and prior to the meeting of the
7 county board of canvassers to certify the official election results for any
8 election in which the canvassers certify the results, the county election
9 officer shall conduct a manual audit or tally of each vote cast, regardless of
10 the method of voting, in 1% of all precincts, with a minimum of one
11 precinct located within the county. The precinct or precincts shall be
12 randomly selected and the selection shall take place after the election.

13 (b) The audit shall be performed manually and shall review all paper
14 ballots selected pursuant to subsection (a). The audit shall be performed by
15 a sworn election board consisting of bipartisan trained board members.
16 The county election officer will determine the members of the sworn
17 election board who will conduct the audit. The audit will review one office
18 that appears on each ballot within the precinct. The office will be randomly
19 selected and the selection shall take place after the election.

20 (c) At least five days prior to the audit, notice of the time and location
21 of the audit shall be provided to the public on the official county website.
22 The audit shall be conducted in a public setting. Any candidate or entity
23 who is authorized to appoint a poll agent may appoint a poll agent for the
24 audit.

25 (d) The results of the audit shall be compared to the unofficial
26 election night returns and a report shall be submitted to the county election
27 office and to the secretary of state's office prior to the meeting of the
28 county board of canvassers. If a discrepancy is reported between the audit
29 and the unofficial returns and cannot be resolved, the county election
30 officer or the secretary of state may require audits of additional precincts.
31 Once the audit has been completed, the results of the audit shall be used by
32 the county board of canvassers when certifying the official election results.

33 (e) The secretary of state shall adopt rules and regulations governing
34 the conduct and procedure of the audit, including the random selection of
35 the precincts and offices involved in the audit.

36 (f) The provisions of this section shall apply to all counties for

1 elections that take place after January 1, 2018.

2 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 25-3104 is hereby amended to read as
3 follows: 25-3104. The original canvass of every election shall be
4 performed by the election boards at the voting places. The county election
5 officer shall present the original returns, together with the ballots, books
6 and any other records of the election, for the purpose of canvass, to the
7 county board of canvassers at any time between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. on the
8 Monday next following any election held on a Tuesday, except that the
9 county election officer may move the canvass to ~~the second Thursday~~
10 ~~following the election if notice is published prior to the canvass in a~~
11 ~~newspaper with general circulation in the county any business day not~~
12 ~~later than 13 days following any election. Notice of the time and place of~~
13 ~~the canvass shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the~~
14 ~~county prior to the canvass. For elections not held on a Tuesday, the~~
15 ~~canvass by the county board of canvassers shall be held on a day and hour~~
16 ~~designated by it, and not later than the fifth 13th day following the day of~~
17 ~~such election.~~

18 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 25-4403 is hereby amended to read as
19 follows: 25-4403. (a) The board of county commissioners and the county
20 election officer of any county may provide an electronic or
21 electromechanical voting system to be used at voting places, or for
22 advance voting in the county at national, state, county, township, city and
23 school primary and general elections and in question submitted elections.

24 (b) The board of county commissioners of any county in which the
25 board of county commissioners and county election officer have
26 determined that an electronic or electromechanical voting system shall be
27 used may issue bonds to finance and pay for purchase, lease or rental of
28 such a system.

29 (c) The board of county commissioners and the county election
30 officer of any county may adopt, experiment with or abandon any
31 electronic or electromechanical system herein authorized and approved for
32 use in the state and may use such a system in all or any part of the voting
33 areas within the county or in combination with an optical scanning voting
34 system or with regular paper ballots. Whenever the secretary of state
35 rescinds approval of any voting system, the board of county
36 commissioners and the county election officer shall abandon ~~such the~~
37 ~~system until changes therein required by the secretary of state have been~~
38 ~~made, or if the secretary of state advises that acceptable changes cannot be~~
39 ~~made therein, such the abandonment shall be permanent.~~

40 (d) *On and after the effective date of this act, no board of county*
41 *commissioners in any county may purchase, lease or rent any direct*
42 *recording electronic system, as defined in K.S.A. 25-4401(d), and*
43 *amendments thereto. On and after the effective date of this act, no board*

1 *of county commissioners in any county may purchase, lease or rent any*
 2 *electronic or electromechanical voting system, unless such system:*

3 *(1) Provides a paper record of each vote cast, produced at the time*
 4 *the vote is cast; and*

5 *(2) has the ability to be tested both before an election and prior to the*
 6 *date of canvass. Such test shall include the ability to match the paper*
 7 *record of the machine to the vote total contained in the machine.*

8 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 25-4406 is hereby amended to read as
 9 follows: 25-4406. Electronic or electromechanical voting systems
 10 approved by the secretary of state:

11 (a) Shall provide for voting for the candidates for nomination or
 12 election of all political parties officially recognized pursuant to K.S.A. 25-
 13 302a, and amendments thereto;

14 (b) shall permit a voter to vote for any independent candidate for any
 15 office;

16 (c) shall provide for voting on constitutional amendments or other
 17 questions submitted;

18 (d) shall be so constructed that, as to primaries where candidates are
 19 nominated by political parties, the voter can vote only for the candidates
 20 for whom the voter is qualified to vote according to articles 2 and 33 of
 21 chapter 25 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto;

22 (e) shall afford the voter an opportunity to vote for any or all
 23 candidates for an office for whom the voter is by law entitled to vote and
 24 no more, and at the same time shall prevent the voter from voting for the
 25 same candidate twice for the same office;

26 (f) shall be so constructed that in presidential elections the
 27 presidential electors of any political party may be voted for by one action;

28 (g) shall provide for "write-in" votes;

29 (h) shall provide for voting in absolute secrecy, except as to persons
 30 who request assistance due to temporary illness or disability or a lack of
 31 proficiency in reading the English language;

32 (i) shall reject all votes for an office or upon a question submitted
 33 when the voter has cast more votes for such office or upon such question
 34 than the voter is entitled to cast;

35 (j) shall provide for instruction of voters on the operation of voting
 36 machines, illustrating the manner of voting by the use of such systems.
 37 The instruction may include printed materials or demonstration by election
 38 board workers;~~and~~

39 (k) *shall provide a paper record of each vote cast, produced at the*
 40 *time the vote is cast;*

41 *(l) shall have the ability to be tested both before an election and prior*
 42 *to the date of canvass. The test shall include the ability to match the paper*
 43 *records of such machines to the vote totals contained in the machines; and*

1 *(m)* shall meet the requirements of the help America vote act of 2002
2 and other federal statutes and regulations governing voting equipment.

3 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 25-3104, 25-4403 and 25-4406 are hereby
4 repealed.

5 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
6 publication in the statute book.
