SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2437

As Recommended by House Committee on
Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

HB 2437 would amend law concerning observance of the National Day of the Cowboy, by stating the fourth Saturday in July would be designated as the National Day of the Cowboy.

Current law requires state officials to issue proclamations inviting people of the state to observe the National Day of the Cowboy, directing the United States flag be displayed on all state buildings, and authorizing display of the National Day of the Cowboy flag on the grounds of the State Capitol Building on the last Friday of July. The bill would specify such proclamations and flag displays should occur on the Friday immediately preceding the National Day of the Cowboy.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Background

The bill was introduced by Representative Becker. In the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs hearing, Representative Becker testified in support of the bill. He stated this bill would codify the intent of the original law passed in 2014. No other testimony was presented.
