Chair Barker and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to speak with you today regarding HB 2671. My name is Midge Grinstead, and I am the Kansas Senior State Director for The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS). On behalf of our members, supporters and advocates in Kansas, we oppose House Bill 2671.

Greyhound racing is an inhumane activity that has been largely rejected by your constituents and the American public. They simply don't attend these races. Greyhound racing has economically failed everywhere.

HB 2671 will increase greyhound breeding and racing, and in turn increase suffering for dogs. As a past shelter director and current board member for the Kansas Animal Control Association, I can tell you that these animal welfare concerns not only impact greyhounds, but the state as well. Public and private agencies will be forced to absorb the costs of investigating related cruelty complaints, taking in dogs with injuries and illness for treatment, and rescue and adoption, as I have witnessed in the past.

Greyhound racing is a dying industry and is illegal in 41 states. Since 2001, more than two dozen dog tracks have closed all across the country and dog racing now represents less than .05% of all wagers placed each year in the United States.

HB 2671 will damage the reputation of our state and will put thousands of greyhounds at risk. We urge you to oppose this bill.
