

CHAPTER 175
House Bill No. 1572

AN ACT relating to public officers and employees; concerning salaries and compensation of certain officers and employees; prescribing the powers, duties and qualifications of certain officers and employees; providing for the appointment of certain officers and employees; regulating and imposing a limitation upon the budgeting and expenditure of funds by certain officers; amending K. S. A. 74-601 and 74-2434 and K. S. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. Increases in salaries and compensation of all officers and employees in the amounts authorized and prescribed under the provisions of this act shall become effective on and after January 1, 1974, and until such time all officers and employees, the salaries and compensation of which is authorized or prescribed under the provisions of this act, shall continue to receive the amounts authorized or prescribed for their respective offices or positions in the Kansas Statutes Annotated and the 1972 Supplement thereto, on the day next preceding the effective date of this act.

Sec. 2. From and after January 1, 1974, K. S. A. 1972 Supp. 28-S10 as amended by section 41 of 1973 House bill No. 1039 is hereby amended to read as follows: 28-S10. (a) The county commissioners shall receive an annual salary as follows:

(15%) of the annual salary hereinbefore prescribed. In any county in which there is located two (2) or more state penal institutions which result in additional duties for the county attorney of such county, said county attorney shall receive additional compensation in the amount of fifteen percent (15%) of the annual salary prescribed in this section to be paid out of the county general fund.

Sec. 4. K. S. A. 1972 Supp. 28-817 is hereby amended to read as follows: 28-817. The county clerk and the county treasurer shall each receive an annual salary as follows:

*In any county having a population of more than sixty thousand (60,000) and not more than one hundred thousand (100,000), the county clerk and the county treasurer shall each receive an annual salary in an amount to be fixed by resolution of the board of county commissioners. The county clerk in those counties where he acts as county assessor shall receive for his duties as assessor a sum equal to five percent (5%) of his salary as county clerk as above prescribed. The county clerk shall receive for his duties as county election officer a sum equal to five percent (5%) of his salary as county clerk as above prescribed. In counties having a population of more than fifty-five thousand (55,000) and not more than one hundred thousand (100,000) where the county clerk acts as county assessor, said clerk may receive for his duties as assessor the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) per annum. In any county in which there is located an active military establishment or state institution of higher education which results in added duties for the county clerk and county treasurer, the board of county commissioners shall by resolution fix and allow additional compensation in an amount equal to not less than ten percent (10%) nor more than twenty percent (20%), of the annual salary hereinbefore prescribed: *Provided*, That in any such county having an assessed tangible valuation of not more than forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000) the additional compensation herein provided for shall be in an amount equal to not less than five percent (5%) and not more than twenty percent (20%) of the annual salary. In counties having a population of more than 45,000 and less than 55,000 which contain a city of the first class having a population of more than 36,000, the board of county*
