SENATE BILL No. 366

By Committee on Commerce

AN ACT concerning occupational regulation; relating to occupational licenses for certain applicants; amending

K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 is hereby amended to read as follows: 48-3406.

(a) For the purposes of this section:

(1) "Applicant" means an individual who is a military spouse, military servicemember or

an individual who has established or intends to establish residency in this state. "Applicant" with

respect to law enforcement certification by the Kansas commission on peace officers' standards

and training means an applicant who has met the employment requirement pursuant to K.S.A. 74-

5605(a), and amendments thereto

(2) "Complete application" means the licensing body has received all forms, fees,

documentation and any other information required or requested by the licensing body for the

purpose of evaluating the application, consistent with this section and the rules and regulations

adopted by the licensing body pursuant to this section. If the licensing body has received all such

forms, fees, documentation and any other information required or requested by the licensing body,

an application shall be deemed to be a complete application even if the licensing body has not yet

received a criminal background report from the Kansas bureau of investigation.

(43) "Licensing body" means an official, agency, board or other entity of the state which

authorizes individuals to practice a profession in this state and issues a license, registration,

to the office of the governor, committee on commerce, labor and economic development of the house, committee on commerce of the senate, committee on appropriations of the house and the committee on ways and means of the senate by January 15 of the succeeding year. The report may provide any analysis the Kansas legislative research department deems useful and shall provide the following items:

- (1) The number of applications by occupation type received under the provisions of this section by for each applicant type, including category of military servicemember, military spouse and non-military;
- (2) the number of applications granted under this section by <u>occupation type</u>, and <u>whether</u> the credential issued was regular or temporary, for each applicant type, including category of military servicemember, military spouse and non-military;
- (3) the number of applications denied under this section by <u>occupation type</u>, reason for <u>denial and whether the denial was for a regular or temporary credential, for each applicant type</u>, including <u>category of military servicemental</u>, military spouse and non-military;
- (4) the average time between receipt of the application and the completion of the application by by occupation type, whether the credential was temporary or permanent and whether granted or denied, for each applicant type, including category of military servicemember, military spouse and non-military;
- (5) the average time between receipt of a complete application to issuance of a license, eertification or registration credential by occupation type and whether a regular or temporary credential, for each applicant type, including category of military servicemember, military spouse and non-military; and
 - (6) identification by <u>applicant</u> category of applicant, including military servicemember,

military spouse and non-military, of applications <u>by occupation type</u> submitted under this section where the issuance of credentials or another determination by the licensing body was not made within the time limitations pursuant to this section—and, the reasons for the failure to meet such time limitations <u>and whether the credentials were regular or temporary</u>.

- (7) the number of applications received by occupation type where the applicant was previously censured, the recipient of disciplinary action or was subject to a limitation, suspension or revocation of a prior credential, for each applicant category of military spouse, military servicemember and non-military; and
- (8) the number of applications granted by occupation type where the applicant was previously censured, the recipient of disciplinary action or was subject to a limitation, suspension or revocation of a prior credential, and whether the credential was issued on a temporary or regular basis, for each applicant category of military spouse, military servicemember and non-military.

All information shall be provided by the licensing body to the director of legislative research in a manner that maintains the confidentiality of all applicants and in aggregate form that does not permit identification of individual applicants.

- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
