Subject: Bill Brief on HB 2336

HB 2336 clarifies when offenders in the custody of the secretary of corrections receive jail credit.

Section 1 amends K.S.A. 21-6606 to provide that when a defendant is serving a previously imposed sentence or on post incarceration supervision and a new sentence is imposed that is to be served consecutively, the defendant is not entitled to credit for time served in custody on the previously imposed sentence.

Section 2 amends K.S.A. 21-6615 to provide that when the court enters the dates the defendant spent incarcerated awaiting disposition, the secretary of corrections shall determine whether the defendant is awarded credit toward post incarceration supervision for that time spent incarcerated.

The bill also clarifies that post incarceration supervision includes both postrelease supervision and parole.
