Written Testimony in Opposition

To the House Federal and State Affairs and the Senate Judiciary Committees

Chairs Barker and Wilborn and Members of the Committees

The U.S. Constitution guarantees the separation of church and state, a guarantee that most of us depend on in much of our daily lives whether or not we think about it every day. But this is one of these days.

I don't want my religious freedom, including my or my family's decisions about reproductive health care, determined by someone else's set of religious beliefs which in no way match up with my own. However, I would never want my own beliefs forced on anyone else. If abortion is not an option for you at a time of family crisis, don't have one.
