Thank you Chairman Suellentrop and members of Senate Public Health & Welfare for the opportunity to testify on SB312. SB312 amends current statutes to give KDHE more authority to deter illegal child care operations and increase the number of licensed and inspected child care facilities in Kansas. This is a measure to protect the health, safety and well-being of our most precious commodity - our children.

For the family of Charlie Mendenhall there is no tomorrow. Charlie died at the age of 7 weeks on his 2nd day in an unlicensed daycare home. After his death his mother discovered that this provider - who told them she was licensed - was not. If she had been licensed, she would have been cited for neglect on following seven regulations mandated by the state regarding infant safe sleep. This family has gone through unimaginable pain. They want to make sure that all Kansas providers are licensed. It ensures our children have safe and regulated environments, with well trained care givers, to grow and develop in when they cannot be at home.
