SUBJECT: Revised Fiscal Note for HB 2179 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following revised fiscal note concerning HB 2179 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2179 would adopt the provisions of the federal Driver's Privacy Protection Act and provide that motor vehicle records are subject to the Kansas Open Records Act. The bill would strike a provision which authorizes the Director of Motor Vehicles to provide records to assist manufacturers to compile statistical reports or notify vehicle owners of potential defects or insurance companies in compiling reports. The bill would also amend the fees available to the Kansas Highway Patrol Training Center Fund.

The Department of Revenue indicates HB 2179 would increase its administrative costs by \$1,000 to update the driver's licensing system. The Kansas Highway Patrol indicates the bill would have no fiscal effect on its operation.
