SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2258 by Representative Holscher, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2258 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2258 would prevent landlords from evicting or refusing to lease to individuals for having been or being in imminent danger of becoming a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or stalking, if the individual otherwise qualifies for the tenancy. Tenants would not be liable for rent if they vacate the premises for the reasons listed above and the landlord is notified. The bill would provide additional housing protections for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or stalking.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of HB 2258 would have a negligible fiscal effect on the operations of the Judicial Branch.
