SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 340 by Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 340 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 340 specifies the types of disciplinary and enforcement actions that the Kansas Board of Cosmetology may take upon proof that a person or licensee is not in compliance with existing law or with agency rules and regulations. The bill would amend existing law to include orders issued by the Board and would allow the Board to fine non-licensees as well as licensees for certain violations. The bill would also make a number of technical corrections.

Based on the number of cases involving non-licensees that the Kansas Board of Cosmetology typically deals with annually, the agency estimates that enactment of SB 340 would result in increased revenue of \$5,000 (5 cases X \$1,000). Any fiscal effect associated with SB 340 is not reflected in *The FY 2021 Governor's Budget Report*.
