**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 359 by Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 359 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, a prearranged funeral agreement, contract, or plan may be made irrevocable as to the retail price of a casket, urn, and outside burial container for the first \$7,000 of funds paid and set aside, at the discretion of the purchaser. SB 359 would remove the \$7,000 cap for an irrevocable prearranged funeral agreement, contract, or plan.

According to the Board of Mortuary Arts, the enactment of SB 359 would have no fiscal effect.
