Re: HB 2174 – Establishing the rural hospital innovation grant program to assist rural hospitals

KFB is the state's largest general farm organization representing more than 30,000 farm and ranch families through our 105 county Farm Bureau Associations.

Kansas Farm Bureau supports access to high quality and affordable health care for all Kansans. Specifically, KFB supports initiatives that will improve access to health care in rural portions of the state. KFB believes that the rural hospital grant program is an idea that could prove successful through a public/private partnership. The requirement to have the grant evenly matched by private sources will help to ensure that there is local buy-in into the programs that the grant will fund.

While there are many ideas regarding how to ensure rural health care continues to provide adequate medical care, KFB tends to agree that local solutions will generally have the greatest likelihood of success.
