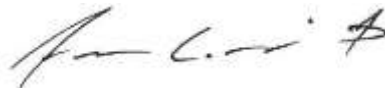
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2292 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2292 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2292 would create exemptions to the Kansas Open Records Act by adding provisions related to cybersecurity assessment, cybersecurity plans, and cybersecurity vulnerabilities at public agencies. The bill would define a cybersecurity plan and a cybersecurity assessment.

The Office of the Attorney General states that the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the agency. The Kansas Association of Counties states that the bill could have a negligible effect to county governments. The bill could help protect sensitive information that could otherwise make county governments vulnerable to attacks. The League of Kansas Municipalities indicates that the bill would not have a fiscal effect on cities.
