I told my Dad about this bill and he SMILED, he was excited! He told me how cool it would be to put on his car, and told me he would want the Space Force plate because when he was in the Air Force in the 90's he was under the U.S Air Force Space Command.

I ask the Members of the Committee to vote YES on HB2015 and show our Veterans like my dad the respect they deserve. I also ask for a friendly amendment: please add the Space Force distinctive plate to this bill.
