Re: **Joint, Proponent, Written Testimony on House Bill 2287, creating the Kansas promise scholarship program.**

Chairwoman Baumgardner and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of House Bill 2287. This testimony is submitted jointly on behalf of the Kansas Grain and Feed Association (KGFA), Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association (KARA), and Renew Kansas Biofuels Association (Renew Kansas).

KGFA is the state association of the grain receiving, storage, processing and shipping industry in Kansas. KGFA's membership includes over 950 Kansas business locations and represents 99% of the commercially licensed grain storage in the state. KARA is an agribusiness industry trade association whose membership includes over 700 companies across Kansas. Renew Kansas is the trade association of the biofuels processing industry in Kansas.

Our associations broadly represent the Kansas agribusiness industry, which provides good paying careers for people in every corner of the state. There is an on-going demand in the agribusiness industry for a trained, skilled labor force, including the skills and training that are provided by many of our state's community colleges and technical schools.

Our industries support efforts to promote a ready workforce with the necessary skills and level of competency. We support the various vocational and technical training programs in our state which introduce students to

House Bill 2287 would assist students with attending Kansas community colleges and technical schools through the new Kansas promise scholarship. This scholarship program would help students to receive the necessary skills and training needed for today's technical careers, and encourage greater workforce participation.

This bill represents sound public policy for promoting workforce training, and encourages participation in vocational and technical training programs by providing financial assistance for students. For these reasons, we stand in support of the measure.

Thank you for allowing us the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 2287 which passed the House on a vote of 155-9. We respectfully request that the committee pass the bill out favorably.
