RE: In support of SB 212

Chairman Hilderbrand and Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee Members –

I encourage you to support SB 212.

I have been a teacher, both public and private, for 15 years. I am also a mother. I strongly believe that parents and their health professionals should decide which vaccines to give to a child and when.

My daughter is now 7, but when she was a baby, she was very small for her age, and wasn't gaining weight properly. I was afraid that all the recommended vaccines would be too much for her body, and didn't want to take the chance of her reacting to one, or being caused irreversible damage. So the pediatrician agreed to spread out the required vaccines over several years, so her body was not inundated with them all at once. We also opted out of some of the vaccines, based on different factors, which the pediatrician and I discussed. (This was when we lived in another state--we moved here to KS last year, and bought a house, and have no plans to move again, so we are here for the "long haul").

Please vote for SB 212 and stop the KDHE from adding the HPV, flu, COVID, or other vaccines to the childhood schedules.

We give our daughter immunity-boosting vitamins and supplements, such as elderberry syrup and raw honey. She is now a very healthy, thriving, bright child with an amazing immune system, and has not had any viruses at all yet this fall and winter.

From experience and research, I have found that a healthy immune system is just as effective as vaccines, in almost all situations (see links below). It seems vaccines are often heralded to be more effective than they really are. In fact, here are statements from WHO and Dr. Fauci about the COVID vaccines:

"At a virtual press conference held by the World Health Organization (WHO) on Dec. 28, 2020, WHO officials warned there is no guarantee that COVID-19 vaccines will prevent people from being infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus and transmitting it to other people.¹ In a New Year's Day interview with Newsweek, Anthony Fauci, MD, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), reinforced the WHO's admission that health officials do not know if COVID-19 vaccines prevent infection or if people can spread the virus to others after getting vaccinated."² <https://thevaccinereaction.org/2021/01/who-fauci-warn-covid-19-vaccines-may-not-prevent-infection-and-disease-transmission/>
