
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2247 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2247 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2247 would designate the portion of K-67 Highway from the southern limits of the Norton Correctional Facility then north to the northern limits of the Norton Correctional Facility in Norton County as the "COI Trenton J Brinkman Memorial Highway." The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) would be required to place signs to indicate the designation.

KDOT estimates that it would cost \$3,420 to manufacture and install two signs for the highway designated in the bill (\$1,710 for each sign). However, current law requires that sufficient gifts and donations be received by KDOT prior to installing the signs to reimburse the agency for the initial cost, plus an additional 50.0 percent of the initial cost to defray future sign maintenance. Altogether, \$5,130 would need to be received from donations to install the signs. KDOT indicates that implementation of the bill would require an increase of \$3,420 to the expenditure limitation for the agency operations account in FY 2022. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2247 is not reflected in *The FY 2022 Governor's Budget Report*.
