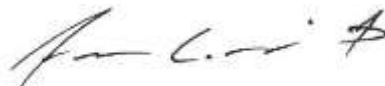
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2634 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2634 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2634 would require a court to order a person charged with a felony to execute a waiver of extradition consenting to extradition to Kansas if such person is arrested in another state while on bond. The waiver would specify that such person waives all procedures incidental to extradition proceedings and would not be released prior to trial in any other state pending extradition to Kansas.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources. The Department of Corrections indicates enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2634 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor's Budget Report*.
