
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 313 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 313 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 313 would designate a portion of U.S. Highway 69 from the northern junction of U.S. Highway 69 and U.S. Highway 54 in Bourbon County, then north on U.S. Highway 69 to the Linn County line as the "Senator Tom R Van Sickle Memorial Highway." The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) would be required to place signs to indicate the designation.

KDOT estimates that it would cost \$6,000 to manufacture and install two signs for the highway designated in the bill (\$3,000 per sign). However, current law requires that sufficient gifts and donations be received by KDOT prior to installing the signs to reimburse the agency for the initial cost, plus an additional 50.0 percent of the initial cost to defray future sign maintenance. Altogether, \$9,000 would need to be received from donations to install the signs. KDOT indicates that implementation of the bill would require an increase of \$6,000 to the expenditure limitation for the agency operations account in FY 2022. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 313 is not reflected in *The FY 2022 Governor's Budget Report*.
