
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 423 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 423 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 423 would modify how reasonable allowances are calculated for nonconforming vehicle warranty refunds. The bill would also define “collateral charges” regarding motor vehicle warranties.

The Office of Judicial Administration states that the bill would have a negligible effect on its expenditures and revenues that could be absorbed within existing resources. SB 423 would also have a negligible effect on how the Office of the Attorney General enforces the Kansas Consumer Protection Act which could be absorbed within existing resources. The Department of Revenue states that the bill would not have a fiscal effect. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 423 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor’s Budget Report*.
