## **HOUSE BILL No. 2129**

AN ACT concerning the state health care benefits program; providing coverage for tobacco cessation treatments; requiring the Kansas state employees health care commission to report on such benefits to the legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Commencing in plan year 2022, within the limits of appropriations therefor, the Kansas state employees health care commission shall implement coverage for tobacco cessation benefits, as described in subsection (b), for enrollees in the state health care benefits program established under K.S.A. 75-6501, and amendments thereto.

- (b) Tobacco cessation benefits provided under this section shall include coverage for:
- (1) Any United States food and drug administration-approved medication prescribed as a tobacco cessation treatment. The Kansas state employees health care commission shall provide coverage for at least four 90-day medication-supported tobacco cessation attempts per year;
- (2) individual or group counseling, including telephone counseling, for tobacco cessation provided by any provider who has education and counseling within the provider's scope of practice, including, but not limited to, a physician, mid-level practitioner, individual under the supervision of a physician or mid-level practitioner, individual who has a tobacco treatment specialist certificate from a program accredited by the council for tobacco treatment programs, or substantially equivalent certification, mental health provider, substance use disorder provider, clinic, hospital, home health agency or Indian health services provider. The Kansas state employees health care commission shall not impose any annual limit for the receipt of such counseling benefit; and
- (3) combination pharmacotherapy for tobacco cessation. The Kansas state employees health care commission shall advise and consult with the department of health and environment to implement safety guidelines for the use of such combination pharmacotherapy that are substantially the same as such guidelines for the coverage of such combination pharmacotherapy under the medical assistance program.
- (c) The Kansas state employees health care commission shall not impose any lifetime limit or prior authorization or cost-sharing

6 7 requirement for the receipt of benefits provided under this section.

- (d) On or before March 1, 2023, the Kansas state employees health care commission shall submit a report regarding the coverage required by this section to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate standing committee on insurance, or any successor committee, and the house of representatives standing committee on insurance and pensions, or any successor committee. Such report shall be submitted in the manner and include the information required by K.S.A. 40-2249a, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
