1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending  
2 June 30, 2021, June 30, 2022, June 30, 2023, and June 30, 2024, for  
3 state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement  
4 projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and  
5 directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements, procedures and  
6 acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 75-4209, 75-6702  
7 and 75-6706 and K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 55-  
8 193, 65-180, 72-5462, 74-50,107, 74-99b34, 75-2263, 75-6707, 76-  
9 775, 76-7,107, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i, 79-34,171, 79-4804 and  
10 82a-953a and repealing the existing sections.

12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2021, June 30,  
14 2022, June 30, 2023, and June 30, 2024, appropriations are hereby made,  
15 restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital  
16 improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental  
17 to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate  
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by  
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the  
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

(c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-  
23 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

(d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the  
25 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

18 receive orders for both necessary treatment products and necessary food  
19 treatment products, purchase such products, and shall deliver the products  
20 to an address prescribed by the diagnosed individual. The department of  
21 health and environment shall bill the person or persons who have legal  
22 responsibility for the diagnosed patient for a pro-rata share of the total  
23 costs, in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this  
24 section.

25 (i) The secretary of health and environment shall adopt rules and  
26 regulations as needed to require, to the extent of available funding,  
27 newborn screening tests to screen for treatable disorders listed in the core  
28 uniform panel of newborn screening conditions recommended in the 2005  
29 report by the American college of medical genetics entitled "Newborn

36 Kansas and technical assistance funded through state educational  
37 institutions under the supervision and control of the state board of regents

39 (d) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development  
40 endowment account in the state economic development initiatives fund.
