SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2070

As Recommended by House Committee on <u>Taxation</u>

Brief*

HB 2070 would allow private, not-for-profit postsecondary educational institutions in Kansas to collect a surcharge on credit card payments. The Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code bars sellers from collecting a surcharge on credit card payments, with certain exceptions that currently include Kansas public institutions, municipal universities, community colleges, technical colleges, and vocational schools.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Taxation at the request of Representative Eplee.

[Note: Apart from minor technical changes, the bill is identical to 2020 HB 2541, as introduced.]

House Committee on Taxation

In the House Committee hearing, **proponent** testimony was provided by representatives of Baker University, Benedictine College, and the Kansas Independent College Association.

No neutral or **opponent** testimony was provided.
