Agency Request

The **agency** requests \$6.6 million, all from special revenue funds. This is a decrease of \$300,000, or 4.4 percent, below the approved amount. The decrease is primarily in capital outlay for computer equipment purchased in the previous year.

Governor's Recommendation

The **Governor** recommends expenditures of \$6.6 million, all from special revenue funds. This is an increase of \$43,071, or 0.6 percent, above the agency request. The increase is due to the Governor's 24/7 pay plan for FY 2023.

House Budget Committee Recommendation

The **Budget Committee** concurs with the Governor's recommendation with the following adjustment:

 Add language not allowing expenditures to be made to investigate or take disciplinary action against any physician who, in the medical judgment and experience of such physician: a) provides treatment or prescribes a prescription drug approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for an off-label use to prevent or treat an infection or a disease caused by an infection in a patient; b) has discussed and presented all treatment options that are appropriate for and available to such patient; and c) determines there is a valid medical purpose for such treatment or prescription for FY 2023.

House Committee Recommendation

The **Committee** concurs with the Subcommittee's recommendation with the following adjustments:

- Delete language not allowing expenditures to be made to investigate or take disciplinary
