Agency Estimate

The **agency** requests a revised estimate of \$375.3 million, all from special revenue funds, in FY 2022. This is a decrease of \$812,250, or 0.2 percent, below the FY 2022 approved amount. The agency revised estimate also includes 90.0 FTE positions, which is unchanged from the FY 2022 approved number. The agency estimates a decrease in Expanded Lottery revenue from the four state-owned casinos of \$912,000 below the FY 2022 approved amount. This decrease is primarily attributable to a decrease in the Gaming Facility Manager Fee expenditures, which are proportional to total sales and are paid to casino operators. The estimate for this expenditure was lowered from the original estimate due to unknown conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic at the state-owned casinos. This estimate will be reevaluated during subsequent consensus revenue estimates. The remaining adjustments include an increase of \$99,750, which is primarily attributable to an increase in ticket printing and shipping costs based on increased ticket sales in FY 2022.
