**MEMORANDUM**

To: House Committee on Transportation

Subject: Bill Brief – HB 2575

HB 2575 designates a portion of K-96 highway in Reno County as the 96<sup>th</sup> “Deadeye” Infantry Division memorial highway.

Section 1 provides that the 96<sup>th</sup> “Deadeye” Infantry Division memorial highway will be designated on the portion of K-96 in Reno County from its junction with 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue then will go northwest to its junction with Nickerson Road. Highway signs designating the highway as 96<sup>th</sup> “Deadeye” Infantry Division memorial highway will not be placed until the requirements of K.S.A. 68-10,114 are met. K.S.A. 68-10,114 provides that the secretary of transportation should not place any signs designating memorial highways until receiving sufficient funds from gifts and donations to cover the costs of those signs. Additionally, the secretary must receive an additional 50% of the initial cost to pay for future maintenance or replacement costs for the signs.
