

To the Public Health and Welfare Committee,

Please support SB6. As stated in the Nuremberg code, no one should be forced, coerced, mandated, required to undergo any medical procedure without full, informed consent.

We saw first hand what happens when unelected officials declare an emergency then push experimental vaccines, mask mandates, lockdowns, and business closures. The result was economic disaster except for the pharmaceutical corporations which profited in the billions.

As it turned out, many of these experts lied. Dr. Brix admitted lying to keep her job. Our own Dr. Norman manipulated charts to keep mask mandates. We are still being told these experimental EUA procedures are safe and effective while the CEO admitted they were never tested for transmission or deaths and are denying myocarditis is a side effect.
